SN	Question	Response
1	How is the school supporting our students in preparation for the national examinations?	In addition to the curriculum lessons, we have various platforms in place to support our graduating students. The <b>Learning Support Programme (LSP)</b> has started since Term 1 to bridge the academic gaps of students. In May, there will also be intensive <b>Mother Tongue (MT)</b> lessons to prepare the students for their mid-year MT exam. In Semester 2, students will also be attending the after school <b>Enhanced LSP</b> to further support them academically. We also encourage our students to proactively engage with their Subject Teachers for <b>consultations</b> .
2	When is the last day of school for the Secondary 4 students?	The last day of school for the Secondary 4 students will be in <b>Term 4 Week 2</b> . More details will be given to you at a later date.
3	Is prom the same as graduation night?	Yes. It is the same.

4	Will the EAE prep be offered to the Secondary 5 students too?	Yes, it will be offered to our graduating cohort of students. We also encourage <b>all</b> students to be proactive to approach their Form Teachers to discuss further during opportunities such as 1-1 conversations. They can also arrange for an appointment to meet with our ECG Counsellor, Ms Christina Ho.
5	What is the criteria for poly students to be able to get enrolled to university?	With a polytechnic diploma, students are eligible to apply to <b>all 7</b> local autonomous universities in Singapore. Admission will usually be considered “holistically based on academic merit, non-academic achievements, and additional interviews/tests (if required), as well as open competition among all eligible applicants.” (Source: NUS website). 6	Can a student apply via the EAE to multiple courses? What can my daughter/ward do if she is given more than one offer?	Applications for the Polytechnic Early Admissions Exercise (Poly EAE) are made at the centralised Poly EAE portal. All five polytechnics participate in this exercise.  Students are allowed to apply for <b>3</b> diploma courses but they are only eligible to receive <b>ONE</b> offer. Do note that if your daughter is assessed to be suitable for more

		<p>than one of her course choices, the offer she will receive will be the course that she has ranked highest. It is therefore important to rank the choices carefully.</p>
7	<p>If a student accepts the EAE offer, can she still back out?</p>	<p>Students who meet the criteria for Polytechnic admission will have their course offer <b>automatically</b> confirmed upon the release of their O-level results.</p> <p>For O-level students, <b>both</b> of the following requirements need to be met:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Net ELR2B2 score of 26 points or better for the O-Level examinations, except for the Diploma in Nursing where the requirement is 28 points or better. Results may be combined from no more than 2 sittings of the O-Level examinations.</li> <li>• Minimum Entry Requirements (MERs) for the polytechnic course you have been offered. The MERs for each polytechnic course can be found on the polytechnics' websites.</li> </ul> <p>Once they are admitted through the Poly EAE, students are expected to commit to their chosen polytechnic and course. They will <b>not be eligible</b> to take part in the Joint Admissions Exercise (JAE), Joint Polytechnic Admissions Exercise (JPAE), or other polytechnic admission exercises.</p> <p>Students who wish to withdraw their acceptance of the Poly EAE offer must submit their withdrawal online via the Poly EAE <a href="#">online portal</a> no later than the stipulated date (usually around October. Dates for 2025 have not yet been released). Students who have accepted a Poly EAE offer but do not withdraw by the deadline will be deemed to have confirmed their acceptance and will not be eligible to participate in the JAE and other polytechnic admissions exercises.</p> <p>For more information on the Poly EAE, you may refer to the <a href="#">FAQs</a>.</p>
